Our January Partner of the Month is The Forest Society North at The Rocks!

Since 1978, the Forest Society of NH has preserved the land in Bethlehem, NH known today as the Forest Society North at The Rocks. Formerly known as "The Rocks Estate," Forest Society North at The Rocks is the North Country headquarters for the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests, a statewide land conservation and forestry organization.

The Rocks encompasses 1,400 acres and includes sustainably managed forestland, a Christmas tree farm, recreational trails, an outdoor amphitheater and the New Hampshire Maple Museum. They offer family-friendly educational programs, recreational trails for hiking, dog-walking and snowshoeing, and an interactive visitor center at their historic 1884 Carriage Barn program center -- now a net-zero facility. All donations at the register will go directly towards The Rocks' continued conservation efforts and community programming.
