Cheese of the Week: Alpha Tolman



Alpha Tolman is a raw cow milk, Alpine-style cheese from Jasper Hill Cellars in Greensboro, VT. Named for Alpha Tolman, a philanthropic dairy farmer who built the Greensboro Library in 1900 (his grandfather, Enoch, was one of the town's original settlers), the 22 lb wheels of cheese are washed with a cultured brine and aged for 8-12 months.

Young wheels of Alpha Tolman have a milky, fruity, nutty flavor while mature wheels develop bold, meaty, buttery, caramelized onion flavors. Alpha Tolman is an excellent melting cheese, perfect for fondue, gratins and baked pasta dishes or try pairing it with a robust ale, a plummy red wine or onion jam.

2025 Board Election: Apr 26- May 10



It's almost time to vote! Our Board Election starts Saturday April 26 and closes on Saturday May 10. In the next few days, eligible Members in NH and VT will receive a letter in the mail with their unique voting credentials from Simply Voting. All other eligible members will receive an email from Simply Voting with their information prior to the election. Don't trash the letter or email - it has info you'll need to vote!

All members have equal voting rights in our cooperative, so each member gets ONE vote. If you share your account with a spouse/child/grandparent/roommate, only the the primary member may vote- make sure you all come to a consensus because you only get one shot at voting! You can return back to the voting page as many times as you need, but you can only submit your vote <u>once</u>.

If you don't receive your voting letter by mail or email, it could be because we don't have correct information on file for you, or you don't own four shares and are not eligible to vote (yet!).
