Cheese of the Week: Red Dragon



The tasty Red Dragon cheese is one of the Heraldic Shield cheeses from the South Caernafon Creameries on the Llyn Peninsula in Gwynedd, Wales. Encased in a bright red wax, Red Dragon (the red dragon is the symbol of Wales and is on the Welsh flag) is a pasteurized cow milk Welsh cheddar. Infused with wholegrain mustard seeds and

Welsh brown ale, Red Dragon has a creamy, crumbly texture (with a tiny bit of crunch from the mustard seeds) and a rich, slightly spicy flavor with lingering buttery notes. Red Dragon is an excellent choice for a table cheese, a grilled cheese sandwich or melted on top of a burger and pairs well with a dark ale or a full-bodied red wine.
