CHEESE OF THE WEEK

Whitney



Crafted in the alpine tradition but distinctly Vermont in character, Whitney is a raw cow's milk cheese from Jasper Hill Farm that pays homage to the smooth, supple melting cheeses of the Swiss Alps. It's made with milk from Jasper Hill's own herd and aged for 3-6 months in their Cellars. The flavor is mellow

yet complex: buttery and brothy with nutty undertones, complemented by hints of fresh hay, warm spice, and a whisper of cured meat on the finish. Its natural washed rind hints at the savory depth within, while the interior offers a springy, elastic texture that melts like a dream—think raclette; Whitney melted atop a plate of roasted potatoes garnished with cornichons and charcuterie. It is also ideal for fondue, gratins, grilled cheese, and baked pasta dishes. Whether cubed for a picnic, melted into a croque monsieur, or simply paired with a crusty baguette and a crisp white wine, Whitney delivers comfort with character.
