Délice de Bourgogne



At Maryland Farm in Ditcheat, Somerset—just 20 miles from the village of Cheddar in England—the Barber family has been making cheese for six generations. They are the oldest surviving Cheddar makers in the world. Barber's 1833 Vintage Reserve Cheddar is crafted from pasteurized cow's milk and aged for a minimum of 20 months. The result is a robust, complex cheese with a

smooth, creamy texture and distinctive bite. Pale gold in color and speckled with crunchy protein crystals, it offers rich, savory flavors balanced by naturally sweet notes. This exceptional Cheddar pairs beautifully with hoppy ales or onion jam, and makes an outstanding grilled cheese sandwich.



An Update Re: Market Match



The current funding for Granite State Market Match is rapidly dwindling and is expected to be depleted by this fall. Cuts that affect New Hampshire SNAP/EBT healthy eating programs have made it unlikely that there will be any additional funding available prior to May 2026.

To extend this valuable program for as long as possible, the Co-op has decided to implement a \$20 daily benefit cap on all Market Match purchases, effective September 7, 2025. By doing this, it will extend our ability to help as many families and households as possible, for as long as possible. We are all in this together, and it is our hope that families using Market Match will be mindful when using these benefits so there is more for others in need.
