CHEESE OF THE WEEK

Petit Basque



From the French side of the Pyrenees Mountain Range, where vast pastures stretch as far as the eye can see and support over 13,000 sheep tended by Basque shepherds, comes the small, but mighty wheel of Petit Basque. A pasteurized, pure sheep's milk cheese, Petit Basque is similar to its famous French cousin, Ossau-Iraty, but with a noticeable difference; a wheel of Petit Basque

weighs only 1.5 pounds. Petit Basque has a thin, waxed rind (inedible) that yields to a smooth, creamy melt-in-the- mouth paste and a rich flavor due to the high fat content of sheep's milk. Savory notes of browned butter and caramel lead to a satisfying nutty finish. An excellent option for the cheese board, Petit Basque pairs well with cured meats, Marcona almonds, cherries, rustic breads and a robust red wine.


